Those programs include projects that invigorate the lives of people around the world and enhance international friendship, understanding and peace.

These programs are funded, implemented and managed by Rotarians and Rotary Clubs around the world. To those who receive this recognition it is because the Rotary Club of Glenferrie believe your life exemplifies the humanitarian and educational objectives of The Rotary Foundation.
