At the club meeting on July 26th, Farmers' Market Director John Hudson announced that the club will donate \$653 to ROMAC, representing the converted value of foreign coins collected at the Boroondara Farmers' Market and from two bank branches in Camberwell.

With the support of the Westpac and NAB branches in Camberwell, coins from all over the world, with a combined weight of 20kg, were collected by the club and recycled through the Rotary Club of Hornsby's foreign coin reclamation program. which for 2015/2016 contributed \$44,000 to Rotary International projects.

The program has been so successful that John will make it a regular club fundraising activity.

So here's a chance to get rid of that foreign shrapnel lying at the back of your bedroom drawer!

Commencing with the club meeting on August 9th, John will bring along a bucket to collect your foreign coins. He will bring that bucket to the first Tuesday meeting every month thereafter.

FATHER OF THE BOROONDARA FARMERS' MARKET RESIGNS
FROM GLENFERRIE ROTARY AFTER MORE THAN 21 YEARS**

This is definitely NOT an obituary but thought I would just pass on a bit of information about Geoff in relation to our Club's (and one of Rotary's) major fund raising sources.

Apart from his valued service in many roles including Treasurer, it was Geoff's foresight that was instrumental in Glenferrie Rotary's involvement with the Boroondara Farmers' Market - only the second city-based one to the Collingwood market which had been established a year or so previously.

I well remember the meeting at Auburn Heights when he put the proposal to the members offering Glenferrie Rotary a great opportunity to operate a Farmers' Market on behalf of the Boroondara Council but emphasising the huge commitment needed from all members. This opportunity had been offered to other clubs in the area but they were not able to commit at that stage - particularly Balwyn with its Sunday Camberwell Market. Somehow Geoff with his sensible, considered presentation of most of the known facts, convinced members that this would be a great chance to not only raise funds for Rotary projects locally and abroad but also raise the profile of Rotary in the Hawthorn Community - and the rest as they say is history ...

The Boroondara Farmers' Market is now into its 13th year, has raised well over a million dollars, been lots of hard work in all sorts of weather, but our long-time Rotarians, our newer members, our Rotaractors, partners and Friends continue to enjoy participating in this great project. Over than 13 years, Terry Rolleston, John Hudson, Ian Salek and many others have taken on responsibilities for setting up the paddock, liaison etc. with the Council and suppliers but it was Geoff Wood we can thank for this great Glenferrie project.
