YOUR MAKE-UP COUNTS!

Member attendance at Rotary events is one of the key measures of the success of a club and of the commitment of members. Attendance at regular club meetings is automatically recorded and reported to the club board and to District 9800.

If you are unable to attend a regular club meeting, make-ups are an important way of ensuring your involvement in broader Rotary affairs. Attendance at another club's meeting, at a District event or importantly at a club fundraising or community service event all count as a 'make-up', and can be off-set against any of the regular club meetings you may happen to miss.

Your service at the Farmers' Market or on the Bread Run are now automatically allocated to you as 'Make-Ups' in the club's attendance register.


Examples of other valid make-ups include:

- » Attendance at a club committee meeting
- » Volunteering for a shift at the Parkinson's Walk or Bunnings Sausage Sizzle.
- » Representative attendance at a meeting of Boroondara Cares, Hawthorn Men's Shed Committee, Booroondara Family Network.
- » Attendance at meeting of other Rotary clubs (including the Rotary E-Club of Melbourne)

RECYCLE YOUR SURPLUS FOREIGN COINS AT GLENFERRIE ROTARY!



At the club meeting on July 26th, Farmers' Market Director John Hudson announced that the club will donate \$653 to ROMAC, representing the converted value of foreign coins collected at the Boroondara Farmers' Market and from two bank branches in Camberwell.

With the support of the Westpac and NAB branches in Camberwell, coins from all over the world, with a combined weight of 20kg, were collected by the club and recycled through the Rotary Club of Hornsby's foreign coin reclamation program. which for 2015/2016 contributed \$44,000 to Rotary International projects.

The program has been so successful that John will make it a regular club fundraising activity.

So here's a chance to get rid of that foreign shrapnel lying at the back of your bedroom drawer!

Commencing with the club meeting on August 9th, John will bring along a bucket to collect your foreign coins. He will bring that bucket to the first Tuesday meeting every month thereafter.

Do you have any spare foreign change hanging around in bags or boxes in the back of your bedroom draw? If so, bring them along to the regular club meeting on August 9th.

LAST WEEK'S SPEAKER - ROS McMORROW

Rosalind (Ros) visited Glenferrie as part of her role as Assistant District Governor for our Cluster. Her presentation focussed on her life experiences, what led her to join Rotary and the differences that can be made to people's lives through shared efforts.

Ros grew up in Adelaide and completed her schooling and university studies in South Australia. She completed her Bachelor of Arts with Honours and as part of her course, undertook studies of "the changing coastline of Adelaide beaches and "the Tambo River in East Gippsland. She then completed her Bachelor of Education. Her father was a metallurgist working with Chrysler for 30 years and it was therefore unsurprising that her first car was a 1976 Valiant Regal 76 with a vinyl roof!

In 1984 Ros moved to Melbourne taking on a teaching role in education. She currently works as Department Head of English at the Sacred Heart College in Oakleigh.

Ros joined Rotaract Melbourne in 1984. At that time there were between 15 and 19 active Rotaract Clubs in Melbourne/Victoria and during her time there she was sponsored by the East Malvern Rotary Club on an exchange to Japan for 5 weeks.

Following her resignation from Rotaract due to age limits, Ros joined the Chadstone/East Malvern Rotary Club where she has held director roles in both Youth, Vocational and International portfolios. She has been and continues to be a very active member of Rotary, involved in many projects and particularly passionate about the Busy Feet Program; Pets in the Park; Preserves and Craft markets; youth nights; and vocational events.

In conjunction with Rotary and using her teaching expertise, Ros has been involved in English programs in Vietnam and Manila supporting women to undertake training so that they can find work. She profiled a particularly inspiring success story involving a young woman, who was supported by Rotary to buy a treadle sewing machine, and who now employs other women making a range of garments for sale.

Ros is available as a resource in her capacity as Assistant District Governor and welcomes contact from any Club member.

ROTARY FOUNDATION FACTS

PolioPlus. Since 1985, Rotary members have helped immunize more than 2.5 billion children against polio. Today, all but two countries are free of polio. As of June 2015, Rotary had committed more than \$1.5 billion to global polio eradication to ensure that polio is eliminated in the last two countries where it remains and that it does not return elsewhere.

In 2014-15, program awards, including PolioPlus Partners grants, totaled \$123 million.
