PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE 20 September 2016

Disappointingly our meeting attendances continue to decline with only 15 members attending on Tuesday evening. As members return from holidays I hope we will then see numbers increase to at least the KLTC minimum requirement of 25 each week.

Those who attended on Tuesday evening were addressed by Phil Storer, CEO of the City of Boroondara. Phil spoke largely about the very topical subject of increased density in the city and how Council is limited in their power with regards to new developments. Because Camberwell is deemed a transport hub we are going to see much more multistory developments along Burke Road. He also addressed the large surplus reported by the Council this year. The surplus funds will be used for infrastructure repair and development and are part of a 10 year plan where Councils have seen annual rate increases capped at CPI and hence limited in their ability to raise rates to cover all necessary asset works.

Last Wednesday I attended a forum hosted by Swinburne for all the Boroondara Rotary Clubs. The purpose of the meeting was to see how we could work more closely together on community projects. Rotaract members were also in attendance. It was agreed that clubs can work individually with Swinburne/Rotaract on projects and in some instances clubs can work collectively. i.e. Rotary Club of Yarra Bend are going to set up a mentoring program Swinburne students. With the Rotaract Club reviving they are now able to offer us more man power for the Farmers' Market and other projects as we may require.

Looking forward to seeing members and their partners who are attending our pre Grand Final function next Tuesday at the Beehive Hotel in Kew. Have a good week.


There will be auctions, raffles and gifts for all members and guests that evening.
