**LAST WEEK'S MEETING**

After the 'Lift The Lid' Auction to raise funds for Australian Rotary Health and, in particular research into Mental Illness, our Guest Speaker was Matthew Hyland. Matthew spoke of growing up in the Horse Racing industry and his continuing involvement. His famous father was the jockey, Pat Hyland. Pat was a Melbourne Cup-winning jockey, just recently inducted into the Australian Racing Hall of Fame.

Pat Hyland was the winner of more than 2,380 races during his decorated career over 30 years in Victoria. Pat gathered the grand slam of major races by winning the Melbourne Cup, Caulfield Cup and Cox Plate. In 1985 Pat won the Melbourne Cup on 'What A Nuisance'. In 1984 he won the Caulfield Cup on 'Affinity' and in 1965 the Cox Plate on 'Star Affair'. Matthew also told us how his father had won the prestigious Golden Slipper Stakes in Sydney on 'Vainí' in 1969, a horse trained by Jim Maloney who was a father figure to Pat.

Matt's journey has followed that of his father. He has been a jockey - until injuring his back - a Trainer and interestingly is in a current role as a Coach and Mentor to young jockeys. He has taken a role with the Victorian Jockey's Association that provides support for jockeys and their families through the Jockey Assistance Programme. Matthew told us of the ever increasing involvement of women in the industry as jockeys.

Mathew spoke of the sheer hard work behind what the public undoubtedly sees as the glamour of horse racing. As a jockey often in fierce competition with his famous father, then as a Trainer his mornings started at around 3:45am. He described the routine as relentless, akin to having to get up seven days a week to "milk the cows". Matthew these days has a far more normal life.

Matthew Hyland is Brendan and Lorraine Rice's son-in-law and is married to their daughter Kate.
